 - i. Proceeds of this challenge go toward advancing ACCP's legislative agenda in Washington DC and will benefit pharmacists in every state!
 - ii. PAC PRN Challenge ends on October 29th at 4 PM.
 - iii. Help promote our profession and support patient care by donating! Just \$25/person can make a huge impact.
 - b. PAC is currently engaged in is the Get the Medications Right Institute (GTMRx)
 - i. Multi-stakeholder coalition that calls for delivery system, payment, and policy transformation to integrate the services of appropriately qualified clinical pharmacists to optimize medication therapy through integrated collaborative practice with physicians and other providers
8. Treasurer's Report: Carmen Smith
 - a. In 2019, PRN dues were increased from \$20 to \$25
 - b. Overall budget for 2019 is comparable to 2018 – we continue to support member research through MeRIT program sponsorship and providing a \$5000 AMED Seed Grant
 - c. Revenue YTD = \$35,948
 - i. 2018 End of Year Balance of \$22,216 plus 2019 membership dues (Jan-Sept) and online position postings
 - d. Expenses YTD = \$11,413
 - i. \$2,000 MeRIT, \$5,000 Seed Grant, \$3,134 PRN Awards/Travel & Training Stipends
