4. Board of Regents Report:
 - Eric MacLaughlin, Pharm.D. (Texas Tech University)
 - a. 365 students attended EMERGE session for residency preparedness, over 400 are attending the ACCP meeting. 104 schools competed, 8 semi-finalists competed, Purdue University won Student Clinical Skills Competition, with eleven other schools participating in competition throughout the meeting. 48 Student chapters are recognized by ACCP. Encouraged other student chapters to formalize student chapters.
 - b. Two new PRNs – HIV and Global Health. 25th PRN approved – Peri-Operative PRN, will meet for first time at next meeting.
 - c. New Standards from ACCP for Colleges of Pharmacy. Comments approved and forwarding to ACCP.
 - d. New Chapter – Arizona College of Clinical Pharmacy, new Regional Chapter.
 - e. Government and Professional Affairs – ACCP's Medicare Benefit Initiative. Please consider donating to the PAC individually.

5. Research Institute:

Rachel Chenault ACCP PBRN

- a. Fundraising event October 12 to raise Frontier's Fund that funds research initiatives for members. ACCP Research Institute Mentors Grant Program – 2 award mechanisms – student/resident research awards up to \$5000. Money given to mentor, for student/resident. Scientific merit, training/development in place, qualifications of mentor/student/resident. Junior Investigator Awards - \$10-40,000. Preference to applications involving collaborative or multi-disciplinary approach. Call for proposals April 1, 2015, applications due June 1, September 15, 2015 awards notified.
- b. PBRN: over 900 members. Current: study funded by Pfizer on barriers against immunizing against pneumococcal disease, looking for 120 unique practice settings for this study. Adult Med PRN will have roundtable at Open House from 8-10am in Convention Center Grand Ballroom G. Encouraging PRNs to collaborate on research ideas to develop into proposals and carried out through PBRN. Second study: atypical antipsychotics use and outcomes, Sanovian Pharmaceuticals, looking at perceptions/beliefs of cost/safety/efficacy for schizo and bipolar disorders and link perceptions to actual use of meds. Looking for 25 individuals to pair with psychiatrists at their site.
- c. Merit Program/Investigator Training Program: FIT program is for more experience in research, 5-day intensive hands-on workshop to developing research proposal for federal funding. K and R awards for NIH funding, foundations, etc. July 9-13, 2015 at U of Georgia COP in Athens. Mentored Research Investigator Training (MERIT) Program – 2 year longitudinal program, starts at U of Georgia with didactic coursework with FIT program, mentorship team and develop research skills through implementation.
